- a window on the rich biodiversity of the Sonoran Desert south of the U.S. Mexico border highlighting the Desert's tropical connections
- · foliage-shaded paths and a "spring-fed" stream
- an introduction to little-known native plants of the canyon oases including several species of native palm trees and Nacapule jasmine
- · a chance to teach people how to include these plants in their gardens
- · opportunities to partner with like-minded organizations in Mexico

You may never have the opportunity to explore these isolated canyon oases in the wild, but now you can experience them right here at Tohono Chul.



## MORE ABOUT TOHONO CHUL'S DESERT PALM OASIS

Just six hours south of Tucson, along the east coast of the Gulf of California, pockets of native fan palms nestle in isolated mountain canyons. Our Desert Palm Oasis is the world's only recreation of the tropical forest of one of these canyons — Cañón de Nacapule (pictured below) — located near the town of San Carlos, Sonora, Mexico.
