Position Summary

Tohono Chul seeks an enthusiastic Engagement Assistant to support the collaborative development and delivery of educational and interpretive experiences that connect guests with the stories of the Sonoran Desert. Working closely with the Engagement Manager, this part-time position provides both administrative and hands-on support for volunteer and docent programs, discovery stations, and educational initiatives and programs. The Engagement Assistant will help set up and facilitate meetings, workshops, and trainings, coordinate volunteers working across different departments, and assist in creating teaching and interpretive materials. This role is ideal for someone passionate about desert ecology, storytelling, and conservation who is eager to work and share knowledge with diverse audiences while gaining experience in museum and garden engagement practices.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities

- Assist with the coordination, preparation, and facilitation of volunteer and docent meetings, workshops, and trainings.
- Provide administrative support for the volunteer program, including communications, scheduling, and recordkeeping.
- Help set up, staff, and maintain plant discovery stations and other hands-on learning opportunities in the gardens.
- Support the "Desert Field School" program and other education initiatives, including scheduling, logistics, and on-site coordination.
- Assist in the design and production of educational and interpretive materials.
- Coordinate volunteers across multiple departments for programs and special events.
- Complete Tohono Chul's docent training program.
- Demonstrate stewardship, belonging, and integrity while supporting Tohono Chul's mission and guest experience values.
- Work a flexible schedule that may include some nights and weekends.

Required Qualifications

- Bachelor's degree in education, biology, ecology, communication, or related field; or equivalent combination of education and experience.
- Strong familiarity with the ecology and cultural history of the Sonoran Desert and a demonstrated passion for sharing knowledge.
- Excellent verbal and written communication skills with the ability to work effectively with diverse groups of people.

- Proficiency with computers and software, including Microsoft Office Suite (Word, Excel, Outlook, PowerPoint, and SharePoint) and the ability to learn new systems such as Volgistics.
- Strong organizational skills with the ability to manage multiple tasks and priorities.

Specific vision abilities required by this job include close vision, distance vision, color vision, peripheral vision, depth perception, and the ability to adjust focus.
